“I’ll let you be the judge of that!”



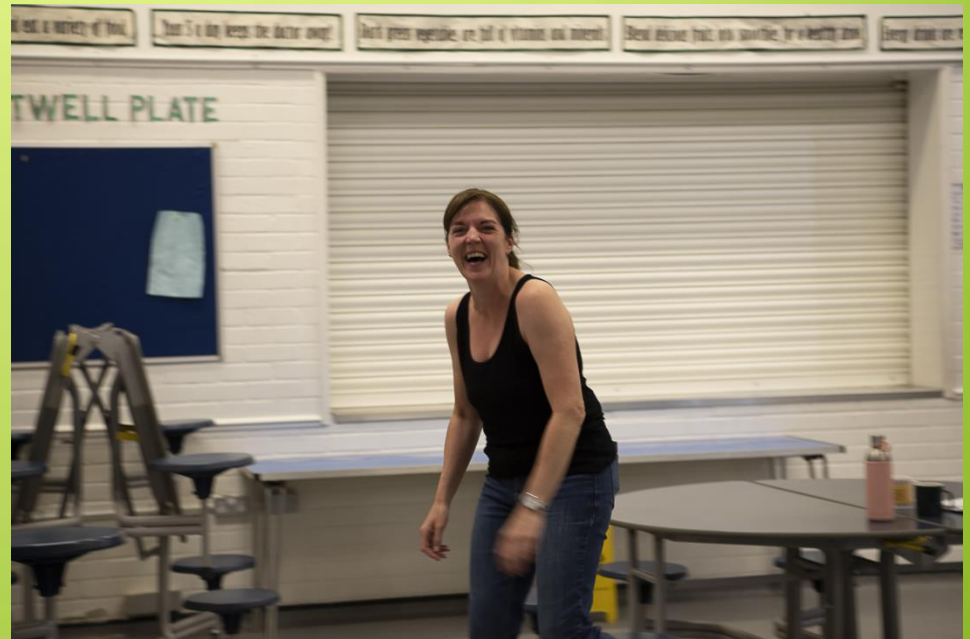




Watching the children watching the show is a show in itself!
